Does "Spirituality" have anything to contribute to the discussion, or is "Spirituality" just a fluffy, feel-good form of self-indulgence?

The lecture will argue for proper consideration to be given to "spirituality" when assessing the needs of staff and patients. But it will ask how this can be done with integrity and honesty in a multi-cultural, multi-faith society.
