## How to use the alphabet chart for communication

1.Ask the person how they indicate 'Yes'
2.Have a pen and paper handy so you can keep track of all the letters the person is giving you
2.Hold the chart where the person report they can see it.

3.Point and read down to the beginning of each row ('ls it row $A$, row $E$ etc..?'), until they indicate the row containing the letter they want
4.Once the row is selected, read along it, starting with the first letter, until they indicate that you have got to the letter they want ('Is it E,F,G, etc...?')
